From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Child of God,

Let us consider the faith practice of prayer. In Matthew's Gospel Jesus says, "Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you." He says this in context with a much longer section about not judging others, keeping a healthy self-inventory, and holding ourselves accountable for our own shortcomings and misdeeds.

In Mark's Gospel Jesus says, "Whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours." In other words, we must pray with confidence that we will receive God's answer.

In Philippians 4:6 Paul writes: "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." These are powerful words – but then we have a powerful God.

From the Pastor's Desk (Continued)

Our God loves us unconditionally; having knit us together in our mother's womb we are fearfully and wonderfully made (Psalm 139). I would gently remind that "fearfully" means "full of awe" and has nothing to do with being afraid. In fact, Paul suggests that we not worry, that we express our gratitude and that we tell God what it is we are requesting. Can we do that? I know that many people within our faith community worry. We worry about the uncertainties of life. We worry about money. We worry about our future as a church. "Do not worry about anything." We are being asked to surrender worry. That is a tall order some days. Is it possible that our prayers go unanswered because we haven't taken this first step? Is it possible that unwanted circumstances arise because we are so critical of one another? "Do not worry about anything" might as well be the same as "move Monadnock Mountain" or "walk on Beaver Lake".

The second thing that Paul suggests is that we give thanks. How many times a day do you thank God? Are you breathing without a machine? Did you tell God how much you appreciate your breath today? Can you walk? Did you thank God? Did you wake up this morning? When you awoke, did you have clothing to wear and food to eat? Do you have transportation? Do you have friends that care? Do you have family? Take an inventory of your blessings right now and thank God. Don't stop until you reach 20 of them. Counting blessings is far more life-giving than counting and recounting our problems. And the Apostle Paul suggests that it is from the stance of gratitude that we go to God with any requests.

Prayer must be an intentional act. We need to take care. I often caution folks about praying for patience. Think about it. If we ask God for greater wisdom and discernment, think about what we might expect to encounter. Wisdom comes from a steady stream of mind-bending, confusing circumstances that are difficult to understand and work through. You see, our powers of discernment are *trained* by the constant practice of distinguishing good from evil. That's what Hebrews 5:14 teaches. And if we ask God for a deeper experience of God's own grace, what should we expect to receive? Answers that oppose our pride and humble our hearts. Take a look at James 4:6. Prayer is a powerful tool when our hearts and motives are the will of God.

Prayer focuses our attention and energy. It is a powerful act of faith. When we clean up our side of the street, when we let go of judgment and worry, when we pray with the expectation of miraculous results our prayers can accomplish so much. As you look around you, what do you need to attend to? Who do you need to forgive? Have you given God thanks for the multitude of blessings that fill your life? Take some time each day. And then let us pray together for God's will for us here at First Parish.



Zimbabwe Container

On September 9th a shipment of goods (books, school supplies, clothing, medical supplies, tools, food, etc...) will begin its long journey from Keene, New Hampshire to Zimbabwe, Africa. A journey that will typically take more than two months. The Board of Christian Outreach and Missions, with the help of the Congregation, will once again participate in this exciting and important program. Missions has reserved 25 cubic feet of space in the shipping container and is beginning to collect items to fill the space. We may be able to acquire more space after August 1 if necessary.



Most of the supplies will go to our sister Church in Dangamvura, Mutare, Zimbabwe with a portion going to an un-partnered Church identified by the Conference. Below is a complete list of Priority Items. This list will also be posted on the FPC website at www.fpc-ucc.org and on the Missions bulletin board outside of the AB Classroom. If you have questions, please talk to one of the Mission board members listed at the end of this article. Also, if you have or can get standard paper ream boxes (18" x 11.5" x 9.5"), Missions would love to take them off your hands. Due to their uniform size they are ideal for the loading and unloading of the shipping container.

FOR HOSPITALS & CLINICS: ALL MEDICINES must have an expiration date of 6/2018 or later to be sent in this container

- Pain relievers ibuprofen, aspirin
- Gauze bandages, antibiotic ointment
- Anti diarrhea medication
- Cough/cold medication, Vaporub
- Vitamins (children & adult)
- Toothbrushes, toothpaste, soap
- Sanitary pads, petroleum jelly
- Blood pressure cuffs (not battery operated)
- Used glasses in good condition, reading glasses & sunglasses
- Hearing aids with batteries
- Towels, bedding (twin sheets, pillowcases & blankets)
- Scales (not battery operated)
- Wheelchairs, walkers, crutches (set at shortest settings to save space)

FOR SCHOOLS:

- Library books, reading books at all levels
- Textbooks (math, science, reading)
- Pens, pencils, erasers, sharpeners, rulers, chalk

Warren A. Pillsbury

Dr. Warren A. Pillsbury passed away May 16, 2017, at 87 years old. He was predeceased by his wife Jean E. Pillsbury, whom he was married to for 60 years. He is survived by his sister: Virginia Lints and her husband Donald; his children: Robert Pillsbury and his wife Mame Green, Pamela Pillsbury and her companion Ted Leonard, and Jennifer O'Keefe and her husband Michael; his grandchildren: Michael O'Keefe, Jr., Nicole Lynch and her husband Matthew, Kathleen Zane and her husband Erik, and Bryan Strode; and his great-grandchildren: Sarah, Emily, and Violet Zane.

Warren Pillsbury grew up in Derry, NH, attending Pinkerton Academy. He earned his Bachelor's Degree from the University of New Hampshire, his Master's Degree from Florida State University, and his Doctorate in Economics from the University of Virginia. He served in the U.S. Air Force from December 1, 1953 to September 17, 1956. During his time in the service, he received the Korean Service Medal, the U.N. Service Medal, and the National Defense Service Medal. Before he retired home to New Hampshire, he was a professor of economics at Lehigh University for 33 years.

Upon his retirement from Lehigh, he made a deliberate choice to enjoy life as, in his words, the entertaining jokester. What didn't change was his willingness to always help others. In retirement, he was able to spend more time exploring metal sculpting and other hobbies. He was never without 50-100 open projects. Anyone who knew him learned more about metal casting and fractals than they could ever need to know. He never lost the boyish twinkle in his eye that would make his wife roll her eyes, never knowing what was coming next. The twinkle in his eye always preceded him telling a story, and everyone who knew him knew he would have a long story for any occasion.

He liked nothing better than being surrounded by his family and entertaining his friends. He is described by those who love him as one of the finest men with a beautiful smile, a great sense of humor, and always willing to welcome a new friend. Never more so than in his church, which he called home for more than 20 years. At First Parish Church in Derry, he was a founding member of KIT - Keeping In Touch, a group designed to keep members involved in the church community. Although it was only intended to last one year, it became popular enough to last for many and is still thriving today. He will be missed by those whose lives he touched, and most especially by his family.


