Also in on **Tuesday the 20th**, Pastor Deborah and the Deacons will offer a **Blue Christmas service at 7:00** in Currier. Blue? Yes, blue as in the blues. As in "I am feeling blue." Not everyone is "up" and cheery for the Christmas holidays. Dealing with the death of a loved one, facing life after divorce or separation, coping with the loss of a job, living with cancer or some other dis-ease that puts a question mark over the future, and a number of other human situations make parties and joviality painful for many people in our congregations and communities. There is a growing attentiveness to the needs of people who are "blue" at Christmas. Increasing numbers of churches are creating sacred space for people living through dark times. Such services are reflective, accepting where people really are, and yet holding out healing and hope. Invite someone you know who may need this kind of service this year.

The following are instructions for the delivery of gifts to the Church. These instructions will also be available when you pick up the child's information.

After you have purchased your gift, please:

- 1. Remove the price tags.
- 2. If this item may have to be returned, place tags and receipt (if possible) in an envelope with the child's number on the front and tape the envelope to the back of the package.
- 3. Everyone loves presents! Please wrap each gift separately and place gift certificates in a separate box.
- 4. Stick or tape a label with the child's number to the top front of the present. <u>This is very</u> <u>important!</u> Missions will replace this label with one that has the child's name before delivering the gift.

Families continue to move through the program, spending about 4-5 months on average before they find housing. We continue to have a wait list for the program, since we can only host 4 families at a time and the need is great. The people who have been in the program over the past couple of years have all been incredibly appreciative of the help we provide. At the annual fundraising Gala in early November, one of the Dads in the program gave a very moving speech about what a life-safer the program has been to his family since he lost his job and was unable to provide shelter for them.

Building Advisory Committee Update

WE'RE DONE!

Before you cheer or exclaim "*It doesn't look done to me!*" let us clarify. We're not finished, but we are done on site for a few months. Moran Construction Services (MCS) has completed the new connector shell and all the landscaping related to the foundation and connector projects. They did a marvelous job and were a terrific company with which to work. Preservation Timber Framing (PTF) has completed tying in the new clapboards with the old siding after performing the sill replacement work. PTF will be re-installing the stained glass windows and may have completed this work by the time you read this article. The Meetinghouse is now back intact and ready to withstand its 247th winter on a much better footing!

But, there is still much work to be done over the next two years. During the coming winter months, PTF will be working on rebuilding the upper portion of the tower in their facility in Brentwood, NH. In the spring, they will be back on site to start the work on the lower part of the tower with the goal of reinstalling the rebuilt belfry and lantern onto a refurbished tower base next fall. This month, EverSource will be installing the electric power lines to the transformer and electric panel. This will provide the power for the elevator which requires greater power than the current power source to the church.

The Rehabilitation Fundraising Committee will be working hard over the next few months to encourage donations from our community to fund the completion of the connector, installation of the elevator and to perform the other rehabilitation projects. The next large rehab project is the work to repair and strengthen the roof system. We have submitted a grant request with the New Hampshire LCHIP (Land and Community Heritage Investment Program) to start that project work next year. If awarded, this grant will provide \$59,000 toward an estimated \$177,000 project. We are hopeful we will be successful in acquiring this grant.

Our internal capital campaign, in partnership with Enterprise Bank, has allowed us to complete the work thus far and to fund the tower project which is supplemented by a \$125,000 LCHIP grant that was awarded to us last December. To complete the rest of our work will now require support from our greater community. So, when you have the opportunity to talk up the work we are doing to preserve the Meetinghouse and to make it accessible to all, do so with excitement!


