From the Pastor's Desk...

Dear Child of God,

Grace and peace to you, beloved child! You have in your hands the December newsletter. In the church year, December is not about gift-giving or shopping — it's about waiting: we await the splendid birth that changed the world like no other birth had previously or will ever. And so we wait: and we call that waiting period "Advent." What I like about the word "advent" is that it composes two-thirds of the word "adventure". As Christians, we are indeed on an adventure!

You see, as Christians, we are called to set our focus first and foremost on "things above," on heavenly things, rather than on earthly things. Each week during Advent, we will be reminded of holy attributes that enhance our earthly existence. We light candles and speak of hope, peace, joy and love. We sing the carols of our childhood: "O Little Town of Bethlehem," "Hark the Herald Angels Sing" and "Silent Night." And as modern folk living in America, we are bombarded with sales, shopping and sometimes spending money we don't have.

Quick question for you: What was the one gift you remember getting for Christmas last year? Next question: What about the fourth gift? Do you remember that one? The truth is, many of us don't because it wasn't something we necessarily wanted or needed. Spending less isn't a call to stop giving gifts; it's a call to stop spending money on gifts we won't remember in less than a year. America spends around \$600 billion dollars during the Christmas season, and much of that is joyless and goes right onto a credit card. By spending wisely on gifts, we free ourselves from the anxiety associated with debt so we can take in the season with a full heart.

Christmas? It starts with Jesus. It ends with Jesus. This is the holistic approach God had in mind for Christmas. It's a season where we are called to put down our burdens and lift a song up to our God. It's a season where love wins, peace reigns, and a king is celebrated with each breath. It's the party of the year. Entering the story of Advent means entering this season with an overwhelming passion to worship Jesus to the fullest.

So how about this year: give more! I know what you're thinking. "Wait, didn't you just say I should spend less, and yet here you are telling me to give more? What is up with that?" The most powerful, memorable gift you can give to someone else is yourself. And nobody modeled this more than Jesus.

So what does this look like for you? Tickets to a ball game or the theater? A movie night? The main point is simple: When it comes to spending time with those you love, it's all about quality, not quantity.



Christmas is about Love. Love a neighbor in need. By spending just a little less on gifts, we free up our resources to love as Jesus loves — by giving to those who really need help. There's nothing wrong with the shopping mall — it's just that the better story is about love. Love by spending more time with loved ones. Love by giving gifts to Heifer in honor of a loved one. Love by donating money so that someone in a less-fortunate country can have clean drinking water. Or make gifts to exchange in your family and give a monetary Christmas gift to your church or favorite charity!

May hope, peace, joy and love be yours this Christmas!



"Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding."
- Proverbs 3:5

Have you ever worked on a complicated 1,000-piece puzzle, only to realize when you have it almost completed that a piece is missing? Sometimes life feels like that puzzle: you keep trying to put all the pieces together, only to end up with missing ones. We search and search for that missing piece, but cannot find it.

We want things to work out logically and in a specific order, according to our plans. However, Proverbs 3:5 reminds us that our logic is not the same as God's. Sometimes it is best to listen to that inner voice, to God whispering in our ear, and trust that things will work out fine.


God's understanding is superior to ours because God knows all scenarios, and sees the big picture. Our understanding is limited. We know only what we have seen and learned, but God knows the entire story. Can we open our minds to let something new in?

When we "lean" on something, we put all our weight in that place. God wants all of our trust, instead of trying to make the pieces of our lives fit by ourselves. Even when you may not understand what is happening, trust in God. What you may need to do may appear backwards, but with God, it is in the right order, and you will feel you have found that missing puzzle piece.

Consider This: What pieces of your life puzzle don't fit like you think they should? How can you start to trust God in all areas of your life?

Take Action: Trusting God, just like building trust in any other relationship, takes time and effort. Think about what you can do today to start building a relationship with God. Maybe you can start simply by talking to God, trusting that through the Holy Spirit, you can build a solid foundation of trust, and build on that foundation of faith to the greatest of strength.

Who's Who at First Parish: Doris Merrill

When my sons were preschoolers, we sat in the balcony during worship, and they colored the bulletin with Doris Merrill's sketch of FPC using colored pencils that I always carried in my purse. Since that time, I have wondered: who was Doris Merrill? Her sketch of First Parish Church has graced our bulletin for years, and has been used as a logo on brochures and t-shirts.

Doris was an active member of FPC from the 1970's to the 1990's (her photo here is from the 1996 FPC Directory). She attended church with her husband, Irving Merrill. She was great friends with the late Dena Spofford, of "Dena's Kitchen" fame.

Doris' famous mincemeat pies were often featured at Harvest Suppers. She was very creative and loved making Raggedy


Ann and Raggedy Andy dolls for the Sugar Plum Fair. Her little mice Christmas ornaments were also very popular. Her little chihuahua, Chico, was often her companion. Doris' husband, Irving, was also an active FPC member who worked on the Facilities Board and assisted with record keeping.

In her later years, Doris cared for her husband as he declined in health with Alzheimer's disease. When he died, she returned to her artistic pursuits to help cope with her grief.

It was during this time that she produced the drawing we see so often on our bulletin. Ginny True and Marilyn Ham remember Doris as an incredibly gifted artist who painted and sketched prodigiously. There are probably other paintings tucked away in attics, antique stores or homes in Derry. Additional sketches Doris drew were reproduced and sold as notecards for church fundraisers.

As we have organized and searched through our archives at FPC, we have never located the original Doris Merrill sketches. If you have any ideas where those might be, please let any of the members of the Historical Preservation Committee know. We would love to display them prominently for everyone to enjoy.




