
Hannaford's Fundraiser Program

Food Basket Program

The Food Basket program is a vital part of our Missions work as a Church. The food basket is kept outside of Currier Hall where services are now being held. The food goes to the Derry Food Pantry and the Upper Room, both important programs supported by your giving. If you have donated canned goods or other food items to this program in the past, thank you. If not, please consider dropping off items in the food basket on Sunday, or anytime the Church is open. Donations are desperately needed and always appreciated.

Zimbabwe Shipment

The shipping container was successfully loaded with supplies on Sept. 10 and is on its way to Zimbabwe. We contributed 8 boxes of books, medical supplies, and school supplies. Thank you to all who have donated but if you were unable, the tentative date for the next shipment is September 9, 2017. To honor the request of the UCC, we donated three of the eight boxes to a non-partnered Church (i.e. Tuzuka, UCCZ) with the remaining five boxes going to our sister church in Dangamvura, Mutare.



In total there were 1206 boxes, barrels, bags, etc... totaling nearly 12 tons.

News from the Council

Council accepted the Nominating Committee's recommendation that Fred Merrill serve as the interim Moderator until the next Annual Meeting. We would also like to thank Chris O'Brien for fulfilling the role of interim Moderator since the Moderator resignation. We appreciate his calm demeanor, open willingness and the ability to keep our meeting on task while giving everyone the opportunity to share their viewpoints and opinions. Thank you Chris!!!

Council agreed that they would hire and work with Dr. David Reynolds to assist Council in the evaluation and improvement in the functionality of the Council Meetings and also to name and manage the Undercurrents" felt at FPC.

Family Promise

As all or nearly all of the newsletter readers know, First Parish continues to actively participate in the Family Promise program, which provides temporary shelter and meals to homeless families in Rockingham County. To date, 10 churches participate in the weekly rotation (soon to become 12!), so our turn to host the families comes up every 10 weeks. During our hosting week, each evening from Sunday through Saturday we provide a hot dinner (from 6 to 7 pm) for the families, an evening "host" (from 7-9pm) who is there mainly to just be a friendly presence, and an overnight host (from 9pm to 7am or so the next morning), who spends the night on the comfortable foldout bed provided, in a separate room. The hosting is done at Calvary Bible church, about 2 miles down Old Derry Road from our church. The Family Promise offices are there, so the families are quite comfortable there and familiar with the facilities. The program has no more than 4 families (and no more than 14 people in all) at any given time; families are expected to find their own housing within 60 to 90 days, with the assistance of the Family Promise case manager.

Last Sunday, the Director of Family Promise (Craig Everett) gave the Minute for Mission, and spoke about the charge we have from Christ to serve the most vulnerable among us. That's who these folks are. They are screened carefully to ensure that they are appropriate for the program, will fit in well with volunteers, and will abide by the program's rules and expectations. They are EXTREMELY appreciative of the assistance they receive from us, though it is often difficult for them to express this because their dependence on us is continual for as long as they are in the program. The program has run successfully for the past 4 years here, and keeps getting better.

Our next hosting week in October 16-22. We have already gotten volunteers for most

of the 21 "slots" we have to fill (3 each day for 7 days), because we have a core group who faithfully and generously volunteers nearly every time. But we still have 4 slots for which we need volunteers: evening hosting and overnight for Thursday (Oct 20), and dinner and evening hosting for Friday (Oct 21). So please sign up; it's a very easy way to make a big difference in the lives of homeless children and their Moms.

I also want to point out 2 other ways that you can help the Family Promise program meet its goal of serving the homeless — (1) buy tickets to our annual fundraiser ("Gala"), which this year includes dinner, dancing to a live band, and live and silent auctions of some great prizes; and (2) consider joining our Board of Directors. The Gala is on Friday, November 4, at 6:30, and costs \$50 per person. Our Board is comprised of 12 people from the community, and we have several open slots. We have a particular need for a bookkeeper or accountant to serve as Treasurer, but we are also seeking anyone who is willing to contribute their time to the program.


