Who is my neighbor?

Dear Child of God,

In Genesis 2 the very first words that God speaks are these: "It is not good for man to be alone." God's first utterance declares that we were created to be in relationship with one another. Financial Support: The services that the Caregivers' volunteers provide are at *no charge* to our clients. Our services are made possible through individual and group donations, foundation support, fundraising endeavors and the towns served by Caregivers.

We can help those who have difficulty maintaining independence and quality of life because they are homebound, elderly, temporarily or permanently disabled, lonely, and recuperating from illness or dealing with chronic illness.

With great support from our 490 volunteers, Caregivers provides to over 375 individuals: Transportation: for shopping, errands & medical appointments.

Visiting: friendly visiting, companionship, social outings.

Errands & chores: light housekeeping, minor repairs or shopping.

Respite Care: provide a break for family and friends who are providing continual care.

Loaner's Closet: used medical equipment for loan, at no charge. Donations are appreciated. We are in great need of bath seats, rollators, wheelchairs and all bariatric equipment.

Last year we loaned out 2824 pieces of equipment and gave away 50 cases of adult diapers. Statistics for 2017

Derry Friendship Center


Derry Friendship Center

For over 30 years, The Derry Friendship Center, Inc. has provided a safe, confidential, alcohol and drug free environment for people seeking and/or maintaining recovery from substance abuse and to participate in activities and ongoing rehabilitative peer support to people in recovery from alcoholism and drug abuse. The Derry Friendship Center, Inc. enjoys a positive relationship with the town of Derry as well as the surrounding communities, civic organizations, and healthcare providers. The Center is open to the public as a drop-in center – when staffed by our volunteers. We encourage the community, our members, and patrons to enjoy the benefits of our services and the peer support and fellowship this provides, as well sharing the experience of helping people seek and/or maintain recovery.

Who we are:

End 68 Hours of Hunger is private, not for profit, volunteer effort to confront the approximately 68 hours of hunger that some school children experience between the free lunch they receive in school on Friday afternoon and the free breakfast they receive in school on Monday morning.

We are entirely volunteer based and 100 percent of funds go directly to feeding at-risk children unless otherwise designated by the donor.

How can you help?

Each week we deliver bags of food directly to the school so that they are sure to go home with the student. Each bag has the equivalent of 7 meals (2 breakfasts, 2 lunches and 3 dinners).

Donations of the following food types are needed:

- Individual snacks (all kinds)
- Peanut butter and jelly (16 or 28 oz plastic jars)
- Cereal (any kind, +/- 18 oz)
- Granola/Nutrition Bars (any kind, high calorie, in boxes)
- Soup (any kind, meaty is best, 18.5 oz cans or smaller)
- · Canned pasta (any kind, 16 oz cans or smaller)
- Cup of fruit or canned fruit (any kind, 15 oz cans)
- Canned tuna or chicken (12 oz cans)
- Dry pasta, Tuna/Chicken/Hamburger Helper
- Mayonnaise (plastic squeeze bottles)

Meal Program: To fulfill our mission, we serve a free, hot meal to anyone who enters our dining room Monday through Friday, between 4:30 and 5:30 pm.

There are no requirements for coming into our dining room and eating, except for sobriety and good behavior. We will serve a meal to anyone who enters, no questions asked. 

First Parish Congregational Church History

The oldest church in the immediate area, First Parish Church was founded by Scotch-Irish Presbyterians in the spring of 1719. Faith was and continues to be a priority. Worship was held one day after arrival, a church body was organized in one month and a building was built in 1722. A "more imposing structure" replaced the first in 1769, and although altered and expanded through time, the main building and sanctuary remain our center of worship.
