Notes: Today's service of worship is a celebration of hymns and hymn singing. Wherever possible, we've included a hymn to either sing or read together based on each part of worship — prayers, scripture, the message, and of course the hymns themselves. Here are a few interesting facts about hymns:

- The word "hymn" actually refers to the text or poem.
- The tune we sing with a hymn is called the hymn tune.
- Check out the Metrical Index in the back of the hymnal (p. 902). The strange numbers here indicate the numbers of syllables in each line of a hymn. By using the Metrical Index, you can swap hymns with other hymn tunes. (Did you know that you also can sing the Doxology to the tune of Rock Around the Clock and Chim Chim Cher-ee?!)
- John Newton, the writer of the hymn, "Amazing Grace," was a slave trader in the 1700's who was the "wretch" he wrote of. He later became an Anglican minister who worked to abolish the slave trade.
- As a 15-year-old, Isaac Watts (1674-1748) referred to the hymns of his day as "dull and profitless." His father responded, "If you don't like these good old hymns we've been singing for years, I challenge you to write a better one." Over 600 hymns later, including "Joy to the World," it is safe to say that he did.
- Many 18th Century hymns contained up to 20 stanzas. Be thankful that our hymnal limits them to six or less!
- Charles Wesley (1707-1788) wrote 8,989 hymns in his lifetime. His most famous hymns are "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today" and "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing."
