Monday: BRIGHTEN – Write a prayer for someone you love and use twine or ribbon to tie it around a candle. Even a small candle will do! Present it as a gift, knowing that every time the candle is used, your prayers will be felt as you bring light into someone's world. #loveofneighbor

Tuesday: PROCLAIM – "On the first day of Christmas..." what does your true love give to you? Take a moment today to tell your loved ones about their gifts and how much they matter to you. #loveofneighbor

Wednesday: BLESS – Over the winter break, many children will have less to eat as they aren't provided with school breakfasts and lunches. Does your church or community have a blessing box or other easy-access food pantry? Donate nutritious snacks. #loveofchildren

Thursday: GAZE – As we retell a story of holy stars and nighttime celestial pronouncements, let evening stargazing remind you of God's astronomical love. Find the nearest dark sky sanctuary at darksky.org and share in efforts to reduce light pollution for the sake of human health, ecosystems, and even public safety! #loveofcreation

Friday: ADVOCATE – December 28th is the feast of the Holy Innocents, as we remember the children slaughtered by Herod in his bid to extinguish the competition. Find time today to send a postcard or email to your elected officials, telling them about the importance of making care for all children a top priority for those in power. #loveofchildren

Saturday: CONSERVE – Whether there's snow or sunshine outside your windows at Christmas, it's always a good time to save on home energy use! Schedule an audit for your church or home in the New Year, and let us know how you're sharing in #loveofcreation!
