From the Pastor's Desk-

Dear Child of God,

Do you remember the hymn: "I love to tell the story / Of unseen things above, / Of Jesus and His glory, / Of Jesus and His love. / I love to tell the story, / Because I know 'tis true; / It satisfies my longings / As nothing else can do." (Our new choir director, Joan, calls them "chestnuts": those old hymns that many of us learned as children growing up in the church.)

"Telling the story" is a theme that God has placed on my heart A LOT over the last few years. Fewer and fewer people - that attend church regularly - know many of the "old" stories - the ones that Jesus learned when he was a little boy growing up and going to Temple. I had numerous conversations with church leaders about leaving the "Revised Common Lectionary" in favor of going with the Narrative Lectionary. I checked in with the Board of Deacons and the Board of Christian Education, as well as Christian Educators. Everyone was excited about the idea. I put a survey in the bulletin and received a handful of responses. I also invited anyone who had interest to come to a gathering on July 30th. 8 people showed up and we had a great conversation!

Starting September 8th we are going to "tell the story" every week. We are going to tell many stories starting "at the beginning" and going chronologically through the ancient stories right up to the birth of Jesus. The order is this: Creation; Abraham; Jacob and Joseph; Exodus; Wilderness; Judges; David; Solomon; Elijah and Elisha; Hosea; Isaiah and Hezekiah; Jeremiah and Josiah; Into Exile; Return from Exile; Preparing

Board of Christian Outreach and Missions

Summer is coming to an end and here at FPC things are starting to get busy. The choir is getting ready to sing again, Christian Education is getting ready to welcome the children back and start up a new Tuesday night study group. The mission board is looking forward to Thanksgiving Baskets and Angel Tree. We hope to be better at keeping you informed about all that we do by monthly Mission Moments & newsletter articles. **Your generosity** is why we are able to continue to give to local ministries and help around the world with special onetime gifts.

In August Jack Kennedy, the founder of Health Access Sumbabwa, gave us a progress report on what his organization is doing. The mission board voted to give \$500 to H.A.S.

In July Dr. Gondongwe from the United Theological College in Zimbabwe visited NH & FPC. He mentioned the need for solar panels for the library at the college. Pastor Deborah asked for donations and **this amazing congregation gave \$3370**. More than enough to purchase the panels. **THANK YOU!!!**

Monthly we give \$100 to the following local ministries: Sonshine Soup Kitchen, First Baptist Food Pantry, The Upper Room, Community Caregivers, Family Promise Nashua, The Derry Friendship Center, Pinkerton Homeless Program, Pastoral counseling.

We also give \$250 monthly to the NHUCC conference.

Did you know FPC has a Pastor's Discretionary Fund that Pastor Deborah can use to help local families in need? They can get gas cards, Hannaford Cards or monetary assistance with bills. **Missions gives \$200** a month to this fund.

One of the ministries we support monthly is **The Derry Friendship Center.** Not only do we support them financially, they also have several weekly meetings at our facility.

The Friendship Center is a community organization that provides a safe & supportive environment for those in recovery from addictions. For over 30 years they have been a huge presence in Derry for people seeking a safe place to talk with their peers and maintain their sobriety. They are located at 6 Rail Road Ave, Derry and are open to the public as a drop-in center.

Proposed Bylaws Changes

First Parish Church Proposed Article I & II Bylaws Changes Membership Informational Meeting

According to the Bylaws (Article IV Administration; Section 2n) Bylaws and mission statement should be reviewed every three years. Since the last review was April 2015 the Council formed a bylaws committee for that purpose. The Bylaws committee has been meeting since March. Any revisions will need a formal vote. In an effort to provide ample time for discussion and congregational input, the committee is now ready to roll out the proposed bylaw changes **in increments by Articles** to the membership. So the first informational meeting to answer questions and explain the process we followed will take place after worship and fellowship on September 22nd in Currier Hall at 11:30am to review Articles I & II. Please read the Articles in this newsletter and if you are unable to attend the Informational meeting please feel free to reach out to one of the members of the Bylaws Committee with your input.

The tentative timeline for the other Articles are as follows:

Sept 4th: the committee will email Article III & IV to Council members to read and review. Sept 18th: Council discussion, make additional corrections and answer any questions

Oct: Article III & IV will appear in the newsletter for the membership to review. Oct 13th: Informational meeting after church in Currier Hall.

Oct 2nd: the committee will email Article V & VI to council members to read and review. Oct 16th: Council discussion, make additional corrections and answer any questions

Nov: Article V & VI will appear in the newsletter for the membership to review. Nov 10th: Informational meeting after church in Currier Hall.

Council then would decide when to call a church meeting to vote on the proposed bylaws.

Proposed Article I & II Bylaws Changes

CURRENT

ARTICLE I. NAME

This Church shall be called the First Parish Congregational Church, United Church of Christ, Incorporated, in Derry, New Hampshire.

ARTICLE II. CHARACTER

Section 1. Freedom - The government of this Church is vested in its members, who exercise the right of full and final control of its affairs.

Section 2. Fellowship - This Church also acknowledges and accepts the equally important obligation of mutual consent, courtesy and cooperation involved in a free fellowship of the Congregational Churches, UCC and pledges itself to safeguard and to share their common aims and work. It declares its fellowship further with all Churches which seek to promote the Kingdom of God on earth.

Section 3. Faith and Covenants - Declaring our steadfast allegiance to the faith that our ancestors confessed, which from age to age has found expression in historic creeds of the Church Universal and of our communion, and affirming our loyalty to the basic principles of our representative democracy, we hereby set forth the things most surely believed among us concerning faith, polity and fellowship.

Faith - We believe in God the Father, infinite in wisdom, goodness and love; and in Jesus Christ, his son, our lord and savior who for us and our salvation, lived and died and rose again and lives for evermore; and in the Holy Spirit who takes the things of Christ and reveals them to us, renewing, comforting, and inspiring the souls of all people. We are united in striving to know the will of God as taught in the Holy Scriptures and in our purpose to

ARTICLE I. NAME

ARTICLE II. CHARACTER

Purpose

The purpose of this church shall be to worship God, to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ, and to celebrate the sacraments; to realize Christian community and unity within this church and the Church Universal; to render loving service toward humanity; and to strive for righteousness, justice, and peace.

Polity (Governance of the Church)
This church shall be an independent body amenable to no other ecclesiastical authority, having within itself all necessary powers of government and discipline. The government of this church is vested in its members who shall exercise control of all its affairs, subject to the laws of the State of New Hampshire relating to religious, non-profit organizations. This church accepts the obligations of mutual counsel, comity, and cooperation involved in the free association of the United Church of Christ, and covenants to share the common aims and work of the United Church of Christ.

Covenant and Faith

Covenant is an agreement which brings about a relationship of commitment between God and his people. We covenant one with another to seek and respond to the Word and the will of God. We pledge to walk together in the way of the Lord, made known and to be made known to us.

CURRENT

to walk in the ways of the Lord, made known to us or to be made known. We hold it to be the mission of the Church of Christ to proclaim the Gospel to all people, exalting the worship of the one true God, and laboring for the progress of knowledge, the promotion of justice, the reign of peace, and the realization of human unity. Depending, as did our ancestors, upon the guidance of the Holy Spirit to lead us into all truth, we work and pray for the transformation of the world into the Kingdom of God; and we look with faith for the triumph of righteousness and the life everlasting.

Polity - We believe in the freedom and the responsibility of the individual soul, and the right of private judgment. We hold to the autonomy of the local church and its independence of all ecclesiastical control. We cherish the fellowship of the Churches united in district, state and national bodies, for cooperation in matters of common concern.

PROPOSED

We hold it to be the mission of this church to witness to the gospel of Jesus Christ in all the world while worshiping God and striving for truth, justice, and peace. As did our forebears, we depend on the Holy Spirit to lead and empower us. We pray for the coming reign of God, and we look with faith toward the triumph of righteousness and eternal life.

A time to grow in community as we journey together as "church"

Take some time... Gather together... A time of sharing... A time of sacred membership... Everyone from First Parish is invited to come together in order to experience some sacred time together as community. We will listen to our presenters together, experience the labyrinth for a focused walk and share our experiences.

Presenters: The Rev. Gayle Murphy and Eleanor MacLellan, Esq. **Also present**: The enormous 11-circuit Chartres-style purple labyrinth

Theme: First Parish: a beloved community

What does it mean to walk a sacred path together?

What does it mean to befriend someone?

What does it **look** like and **feel like** to be in community?

The labyrinth is not an event. It is not "one and done". The labyrinth is a multifaceted tool and it is a divine inspiration. In much the same way the prayer and exercise are not "one shot deals", the labyrinth is practice and a method of reflection or contemplation or centering.

The labyrinth that will be with us for this time together has come to our church before. The difference this time is that this labyrinth's creator, Eleanor MacLellan, will be with us as well. Eleanor wrote a book entitled, "Sole to Soul: Walking a Path toward Loving Accompaniment" giving an accounting of a particular time in her family's life and what the labyrinth represented to her along the way. In her book Eleanor talks about traversing life's labyrinthine paths.

The Rev. Gayle Murphy was co-pastor at South Congregational Church in Concord, Eleanor's church, when life dealt particularly harshly with her and her journey into the labyrinth began. Gayle is also one of the 5 women who walked this path with her.

These women have learned much about what it is to accompany one another lovingly on life's journey. They are excited to lead us in this way as we begin to consider how we walk with one another here at First Parish. The labyrinth is a profound metaphor for life. Just like life, there is an uncanny karma about the labyrinth: what you sow, so shall you reap.

Pastor Gayle and Eleanor will present some things for us to think about and then we will have the opportunity to walk the labyrinth or to do some journaling or to simply chat informally with members we do not know well.

Eleanor will have books available for purchase on that day. Please join us.



First Parish Congregational Church History

The oldest church in the immediate area, First Parish Church was founded by Scotch-Irish Presbyterians in the spring of 1719. Faith was and continues to be a priority. Worship was held one day after arrival, a church body was organized in one month and a building was built in 1722. A "more imposing structure" replaced the first in 1769, and although altered and expanded through time, the main building and sanctuary remain our center of worship.
