During the Blue Christmas service we allow space for lament and we honor the struggle that accompanies conflicted feelings. If you have lost someone this year, join us to honor the gift of sadness that comes from loving someone who has died. You are invited to bring a friend or invite someone you know who might be struggling. This service is open to the community.

Tuesday, December 17 at 7pm. We hope that you will join us.



First Parish Congregational Church History

The oldest church in the immediate area, First Parish Church was founded by Scotch-Irish Presbyterians in the spring of 1719. Faith was and continues to be a priority. Worship was held one day after arrival, a church body was organized in one month and a building was built in 1722. A "more imposing structure" replaced the first in 1769, and although altered and expanded through time, the main building and sanctuary remain our center of worship.
