Lighting of the Advent Candle for the Fourth Sunday of Advent: **Love**

One: In the beginning was the Word— spoken and breathed, a promise made and kept.

Many: Persevere in hope, keep the faith—God’s promise is true!

(The first candle – the candle of HOPE – is lit.)

One: The Word was in the beginning, and through him all things come into being.

Many: Eternal and near at hand, Already and not-yet, God’s promise is the peace in our hearts and the foundation of all life.

(The second candle – the candle of PEACE – is lit.)

One: Keep going! Persevere in joy, giving voice to God’s presence yet again.

(The third candle – the candle of JOY – is lit.)

Many: We trust the good news—God’s promise is true!

One: Trust in God! Wait with faith, giving voice to Christ’s love for all.

(The fourth candle – the candle of LOVE – is lit.)

WE HEAR GOD'S WORD FOR US

NEW TESTAMENT: Luke 1:57-80

⁵⁷ Now the time came for Elizabeth to give birth, and she bore a son. ⁵⁸ Her neighbors and relatives heard that the Lord had shown his great mercy to her, and they rejoiced with her.

⁵⁹ On the eighth day they came to circumcise the child, and they were going to name him Zechariah after his father.

⁶⁰ But his mother said, “No; he is to be called John.” ⁶¹ They said to her, “None of your relatives has this name.” ⁶² Then they began motioning to his father to find out what name he wanted to give him. ⁶³ He asked for a writing tablet and wrote, “His name is John.” And all of them were amazed.

⁶⁴ Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue freed, and he began to speak, praising God. ⁶⁵ Fear came over all their neighbors, and all these things were talked about throughout the entire hill country of Judea. ⁶⁶ All who heard them pondered them and said, “What then will this child become?” For, indeed, the hand of the Lord was with him.

⁶⁷ Then his father Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke this prophecy:

⁶⁸ “Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has looked favorably on his people and redeemed them.

⁶⁹ He has raised up a mighty savior in the house of his servant David,

⁷⁰ as he spoke through the mouth of his holy prophets from of old,

⁷¹ that we would be saved from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us.

⁷² Thus he has shown the mercy promised to our ancestors, and has remembered his holy covenant,

⁷³ the oath that he swore to our ancestor Abraham, to grant us ⁷⁴ that we, being rescued from the hands of our enemies, might serve him without fear, ⁷⁵ in holiness and righteousness before him all our days.

⁷⁶ And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways,

⁷⁷ to give knowledge of salvation to his people by the forgiveness of their sins.

⁷⁸ By the tender mercy of our God, the dawn from on high will break upon us,

⁷⁹ to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace.”

⁸⁰ The child grew and became strong in spirit, and he was in the wilderness until the day he appeared publicly to Israel.

Budget Updates

Finance and Council have been working to manage the 2019 budget and draft the 2020 budget. Our financial challenges continue to be significant. Our latest projections show we're likely to end 2019 with a deficit. Anything you can do to fulfill your pledges or possibly give an additional gift at Christmas time could help us end the year in a better position.

The larger concern is the status of the 2020 budget. The current draft has a \$45,000 deficit. Obviously this isn't a viable budget. The solutions won't be easy. We need your help to find the solutions that are best for our congregation.

We are offering budget information sessions after worship on January 5th and 19th. We'll provide budget overviews and as much detail as anyone wants. We hope you'll join us to better understand the issues we're dealing with, hear the ideas we're contemplating, and offer your ideas.
