Dear Child of God,

Welcome to our worship service this morning! Our order of worship at First Parish follows a pattern that is common in many Protestant churches. We call it “liturgy”.

First, we “gather” by singing and calling to worship and praying in an inclusive, interactive way.

Secondly, we invite our children forward and speak directly to them about the scripture focus for the day. They are then excused to go to their age-appropriate classes.

Thirdly, we listen to sacred scripture and hear the proclaimed Word, usually in the form of a sermon.

Next, we then **respond** to God’s Word in two ways: prayer and financial giving. We are reminded that it is time to go out into the world – having been lifted up ourselves and having our faith reenergized so that we might take the Good News of forgiveness and redemption into the world where we live and work and play.

We pray that you will find God’s Presence and Peace among us. If you have any questions for any of us, please don’t hesitate to ask.

WE HEAR GOD'S WORD FOR US

NEW TESTAMENT: Mark 2:1-22: Jesus Heals a Paralytic; Jesus Calls Levi; and The Question about Fasting

I. Jesus Heals a Paralytic

Narrator: When he returned to Capernaum after some days, it was reported that he was at home. So many gathered around that there was no longer room for them, not even in front of the door; and he was speaking the word to them. Then some people came, bringing to him a paralyzed man, carried by four of them. And when they could not bring him to Jesus because of the crowd, they removed the roof above him; and after having dug through it, they let down the mat on which the paralytic lay. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic,

Jesus: “Son, your sins are forgiven.”

Narrator: Now some of the scribes were sitting there, questioning in their hearts,

Scribes: “Why does this fellow speak in this way? It is blasphemy! Who can forgive sins but God alone?”

Narrator: At once Jesus perceived in his spirit that they were discussing these questions among themselves; and he said to them,

Jesus: “Why do you raise such questions in your hearts? Which is easier, to say to the paralytic, ‘Your sins are forgiven,’ or to say, ‘Stand up and take your mat and walk’? But so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins” (to the paralytic) “I say to you, stand up, take your mat and go to your home.”

Narrator: And (the man) stood up, and immediately took the mat and went out before all of them; so that they were all amazed and glorified God, saying,

People: “We have never seen anything like this!”

II. Jesus Calls Levi

Narrator: Jesus went out again beside the sea; the whole crowd gathered around him, and he taught them. As he was walking along, he saw Levi son of Alphaeus sitting at the tax booth, and he said to him,

Jesus: “Follow me.”

Narrator: And he got up and followed him. And as (Jesus) sat at dinner in Levi’s house, many tax collectors and sinners were also sitting with Jesus and his disciples—for there were many who followed him. When the scribes of the Pharisees

saw that he was eating with sinners and tax collectors, they said to his disciples,

Scribes: “Why does he eat with tax collectors and sinners?”

Jesus: “Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick; I have come to call not the righteous but sinners.”

III. The Question about Fasting

Narrator: Now John’s disciples and the Pharisees were fasting; and people came and said to him,

People: “Why do John’s disciples and the disciples of the Pharisees fast, but your disciples do not fast?”

Jesus: “The wedding guests cannot fast while the bridegroom is with them, can they? As long as they have the bridegroom with them, they cannot fast. The days will come when the bridegroom is taken away from them, and then they will fast on that day.

“No one sews a piece of unshrunk cloth on an old cloak; otherwise, the patch pulls away from it, the new from the old, and a worse tear is made. And no one puts new wine into old wineskins; otherwise, the wine will burst the skins, and the wine is lost, and so are the skins; but one puts new wine into fresh wineskins.”
