SHARING the MEAL

As we celebrate Communion today, you will remain seated. The elements will be brought to you - the ushers will serve each half-row. You will first be invited to take the bread – which you will HOLD so that we can ALL take the bread together. This symbolizes that we are ONE BODY and that we are all one in the Spirit of Christ.

(Please let us know if you need gluten-free bread.)

You will then be invited to take a cup of grape juice which symbolizes the cup of wine that Jesus shared with his friends, saying "This is my blood shed for you." You are invited to prayerfully drink the cup in your own time. This demonstrates that we are each individuals in God's Presence - each one doing the best that they can to be the hands and feet of Christ on this earth.
