## From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Child of God,

I pray that your life is as full of God-winks as it is pandemic induced disappointments. Covid-19 and the Delta variant are pushing our boundaries, as well as our patience! We all want our most beloved activities to resume! In the case of worship services, we haven't missed a Sunday since this whole thing began to provide some manner of worship hour – although seeing one another in person is the most desirable. That is why I offered so many outdoor opportunities. It was a joy to see many of you on those occasions and to welcome new faces among us. The good news is this: Resuming in-person worship in our Currier sanctuary is scheduled to take place this month – all the while continuing to live stream for our distant friends! Thanks be to God!

Will it be “like it was?” Unfortunately, no, it will not. In order to provide the safest worship experience possible there will be changes to the way we used to do things. Masks will be worn at all times in the building Sunday morning. When you enter the building, you will be welcomed but you will pick up your bulletin and drop off your offering in the foyer/narthex. The Currier sanctuary will appear differently with chairs in groups rather than rows, allowing us to maintain distance from one another. The worship team (i.e. pastor, musician and lay reader) will be on the stage. The worship service itself will be shorter and children

will remain with their parents for the service. We won't stand and sit numerous times during the service but remain seated throughout.

Are all of these changes necessary? We believe that they are or we wouldn't resume in person services. We believe that your desire to come together again will motivate you to join with us in loving our neighbor by protecting them. My daughter, who has a doctorate in nursing practice, reminded me that even vaccinated people with no symptoms can carry and transmit this disease. We want to assure everyone's safety.

So, if you are comfortable with the safety precautions that we are making, we hope to see you soon. And if you believe that it is safer to stay at home, please join us online as we will continue to use zoom and Facebook to reach you.



If I could also invite you to participate in the creative activities that I have been talking about since my Sabbatical on **October 16 and 30, 9-12**. These are Saturday mornings. Please come and join me in the activity of creating glass garden totems, otherwise known as sculptures. PLEASE NOTE: a friend of mine pointed out that when I use the word "pieces", she thought that I meant broken glass. On the contrary, these are items of glassware like teacups or teapots, platters or vases, pickle bowls or jelly jars. Anything that is pretty, colorful or intriguing – and unwanted. We will be gluing these items of glassware to each other building a "totem" or statue that is unique, colorful and fun!! What does any of this have to do with God, you may be asking yourself. I learned while on Sabbatical that God is most present when we are grateful and creative. Don't forget Genesis 1! God created and it was good! Our God is a creating and fun-loving God. Our God smiles when we work together and when we play together.

**Who:** Children in pre-K through 12th grade (*Pre-k - Kindergarten, Elementary School, Middle School, Youth, & Confirmation Program (7<sup>th</sup> grade – 12<sup>th</sup> grade)* )

**What:** Children's Christian Education Program; formerly "Church School" or; formerly "Sunday School"

**When:** Sunday 11:00 am – 12:00 pm; REMINDER: CHILDREN WILL BE SITTING WITH THEIR FAMILIES DURING THE 10:00 AM SUNDAY SERVICES. SERVICES WILL BE SHORTER AND ACTIVITY BAGS WILL BE AVAILABLE ACCOMPANIED BY AGE-APPROPRIATE ACTIVITY BULLETINS.

**Where:** Classes will 1 hour long; children in grades pre-k - 8 will meet in John, Luke and Cook Conference Rooms downstairs; Confirmation (grades 7-12) will meet in Corinthians Conference Room upstairs.

**Why:** While schools are in session, we can be in session. Return the focus to equipping parents with the tools to nurture their children's faith. Age-specific classes are important, so children are able to learn at their pace and on their level without denying them the growth opportunity as they learn about, serve, and worship God with their parents and Church family.

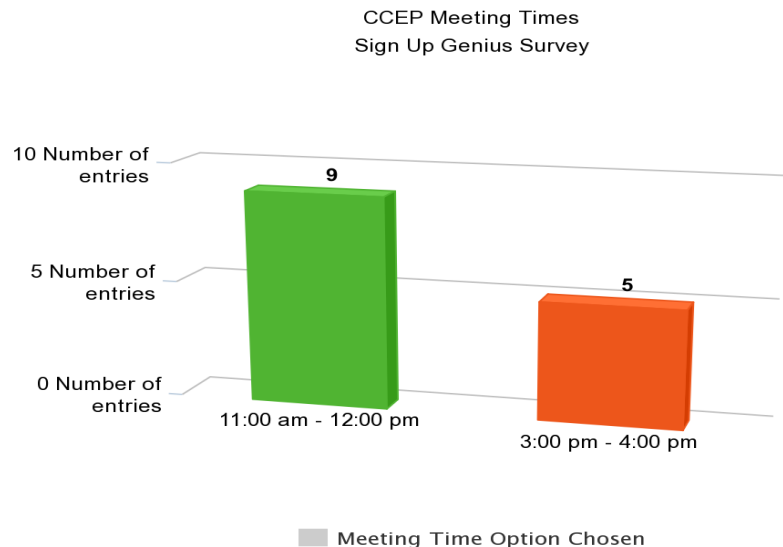
#### Safety Measures will include:

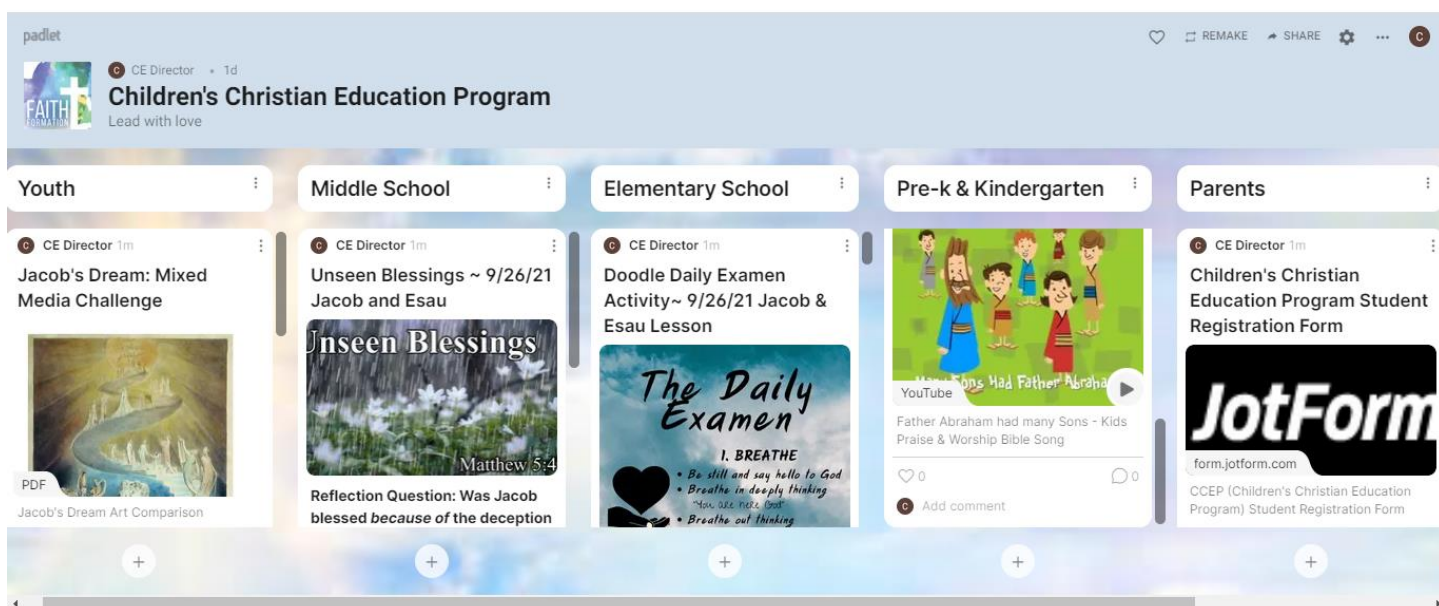

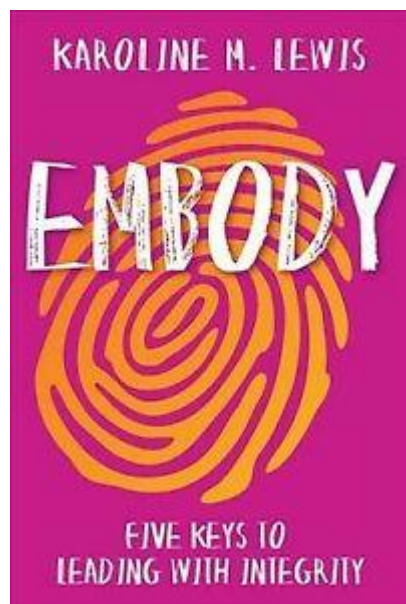

## Letter from Council

Return to in-person Services:

At the Council meeting on September 15<sup>th</sup> there was an extended conversation in regard to returning to “In Person” worship. 17 participants were present to voice their concerns both pro and against and two opinions of absent interested individuals were entered into the record. This was a cordial and courteous discussion. At the conclusion the council voted unanimously to return to in person worship on October 10<sup>th</sup>, all things being as they are now. In other words, one of the caveats is that if one of the two following things occur, we will be forced to discontinue in person worship and resort to zoom again. Those two things are: if the Derry School system closes all schools or if the Governor imposes a lockdown again. We discussed whether to require proof of vaccination and voted not to. We will require masks at all times. There will be no wiggle room on this. Children programs, under the direction of CE, will have a separate time for education. Streaming will continue for a stay-at-home option.

As you can imagine, this was a difficult decision on both sides. We want all our congregants to stay safe, but we all seem to miss being in person and the majority saw it that way. We must encourage no hugging or physical contact and there will be no fellowship after the service. The room will be set up to promote spacing. Communion will be different, in order to maintain safety. Please help the leaders to make this as safe as possible so that we can continue to be together.

## Meetinghouse Presentation Update

The initial lead paint scraping and surface preparation on the Meetinghouse proved inadequate, so the company returned in mid-September to do two more weeks of work. Painting of the exterior should begin in early October.

The Connector Interior is mostly done. There is a bit more interior painting for Keeley to do, Morin needs to install door hardware and such, and Liberty Electric must complete the fire alarm system yet. But we are mainly waiting for Stanley Elevator to return and complete the elevator installation. The state will then need to inspect and certify the elevator for use, so it's unclear just now when we might be able to have a "grand opening" of the Connector. Hopefully early November.

Busy contractor schedules have slowed these projects, but we are nearing the end for 2021. It looks like we'll finish the year with about \$20K remaining in the Rehab Fund.

Your BAC team has been fully occupied managing the current projects. We will soon return to developing detailed project plans and a budget for the next significant challenge: rehabbing the Sanctuary and re-opening it for use.
