Do you promise, by the grace of God, to be Christ's disciples, to follow in the way of Jesus' teachings, to resist oppression, to show love and justice, and to share your life in Jesus Christ with others, as best you are able? (**We do.**)

To the gathered Congregation: As witnesses of this sacred moment, will you be an example of faith and compassion, and will you help this family in teaching the stories of our faith as best you are able? If you do, please affirm by saying "We so promise." (We so promise.)

- ^{1:20} And God said, "Let the waters bring forth swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the dome of the sky." ²¹ So God created the great sea monsters and every living creature that moves, of every kind, with which the waters swarm, and every winged bird of every kind.
- ²² <u>God blessed them</u>, saying, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth." ²³ And there was evening and there was morning, the fifth day.


