### From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Child of God,

Let the **Advent**ure of Advent begin! We will await together a baby's birth which represents for us the birth of hope, the renewal of forgiveness, and the rebirth of the promise of peace. As we walk this journey together – from darkness into the light – may we bask in the knowledge of God's love for us and may we pierce whatever darkness surrounds us with the light within us.

You may remember my own father's story of being saved by the French Resistance in 1945 in France. Dad was a pilot in the US Army Air Corps/US Air Force during WWII. His plane was shot down in April 1945, he broke his leg, just missed getting captured and was harbored by members of the French Resistance for three months. They saved his life. For this reason, whenever I hear French Resistance stories, my ears perk up.

Abbé Pierre (1912 – 2007) was a French Catholic priest who was a vital member of the Resistance during World War II. He wrote the following poem about hope and personal responsibility:

I will continue to believe, even if everyone loses hope.

I will continue to love, even if others distill hatred.

I will continue to build, even if others destroy.

I will continue to talk peace even in the midst of a war.

I will continue to spread light, even in the midst of darkness.

I will continue to sow, even if others trample the harvest.

And I will continue to shout, even if others are silent.

And I will draw smiles on faces in tears.

And I will bring relief, when we see the pain.

And I will offer reasons for joy where there is only sadness.

I will encourage the one who decided to stop to keep walking ...

And I will stretch out my arms to those who feel exhausted.

But Abbé Pierre wasn't just a poet and a priest. He put his faith into activism. In 1949, he founded the Emmaus movement, with the goal of helping poor and homeless people and refugees. Progress was very slow. On February 1, 1954, Pierre took to the airwaves, informing the French people of the dire situation that existed and pleading for help. The next day the media went wild proclaiming an "Uprising of Kindness."

Pierre's message included facts: "A woman froze to death tonight at 3:00 AM, on the pavement of Sebastopol Boulevard, clutching the eviction notice which the day before had made her homeless... Each night, more than two thousand endure the cold, without food, without bread, more than one almost naked. To face this horror, emergency lodgings are not enough." He talked about aid centers and the need for warm blankets, fresh water, hot soup. The temperature was the coldest they had ever seen. Pierre went on to say: "The forecast is for a month of harsh frosts. For as long as the winter lasts, for as long as the centers exist, faced with their brothers dying in poverty, all mankind must be of one will: the will to make this situation impossible. I beg of you, let us love one another enough to do it now. From so much pain, let a wonderful thing be given unto us: the shared spirit of France. Thank you! Everyone can help those who are homeless. We need, tonight, and at the latest tomorrow, five thousand blankets, three hundred big American tents, and two hundred catalytic stoves."

This "uprising of kindness" and the now-famous call for help ended up raising 500 million francs in donations. This enormous amount was totally unexpected; telephone operators and the postal service were overwhelmed, and owing to the volume of donations, several weeks were needed just to sort them, distribute them, and find a place to stock them throughout the country.

An "uprising of kindness" is what we need today. We suffer from a pandemic of mistrust and misinformation. During these times that we are living in, we need to dig deep into our souls and find whatever kernels of kindness and of hope we can muster. With kindness and hope, we can bring light into our own dark times.

May Advent 2021 be transforming for you and may the light within you that you find be the light that saves others. And to God be the glory!

#### **ADVENT STORY TRAIL**



You may have seen or maybe you've visited a "Live Nativity," "Stations of the Cross," or some similar type of "walk-through" learning experience. The "Advent Bible Story Trail" is a similar type of "journey" through a story — and one that seems like a particularly good fit for the social-distancing needs as we face concerns of Covid-19 surges and breakthrough variants.

The following idea for an "Advent Trail" was inspired by one author's local nature center. They enlarged and laminated the pages of children's

nature books and placed the laminated page along the side of a short trail near the center.

Similarly, everyone is invited to walk along the trail with an activity guide, during Advent, around the First Parish Church grounds, and at the end of the Story Trail warm up with a cup of warm cider or hot cocoa and a snack before joining the Advent Workshop festivities.

At First Parish we have abundant resources: an amazing physical plant and an equaling amazing staff. We are able to pay salaries and keep the lights on! We host a pre-school and community groups like Scouts – Boys and Girls, as well as recovery groups like AA. We offer a monthly spaghetti supper for the community at no cost to them. Our annual budget last year was \$291,000 but that was a deficit budget. It was risky but we adopted it prayerfully and many people stepped up financially. We are close but we are not quite in the black yet.

Please prayerfully consider how you might help the church financially this Christmas. Perhaps you can pledge a certain amount for next year. Perhaps you are one of the lucky ones who has more than they need right now and would be in a financial position to offer a Christmas gift to FPC. We prayerfully hope that we might end this year in the black. You can trust that if we end this year in the black and there is a surplus, it will help us going into next year's budget.

Worship was held one day after arrival; a church body was organized in one month and a building was built in 1722. A "more imposing structure" replaced the first in 1769, and although altered and expanded through time, the main building and sanctuary remain our center of worship.
