From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Child of God,

Liz and I recently attended "The Wild Goose Festival" in NC. I learned that the wild goose is an appropriate symbol for the Holy Spirit. Who knew? And it fits!! "A wild goose is strong, beautiful and ... utterly unpredictable. It often surprises and disturbs our plans, leading us on wild and wonderful adventures." How often does God, aka the Holy Spirit, lead us on a wonderful adventure? Often enough we are surprised and sometimes disturbed when God intervenes in our lives and nudges into our plans. We had everything figured out and poof! A conversation, an email, a letter – and "our" plans take a detour for "new" plans. When we trust that God is always with us, these "new" plans can turn out to be better than what we had envisioned. That is the way of God.

The first day of the festival, I attended an all-day seminar for people who want to publish a book. One of the first things I learned was that the book is like an iceberg - that the book itself is what everyone (hopefully) sees and reads, and that there is an enormous amount of work that goes into getting published. In this day and age, it is more difficult than ever to even *get* published. One must have an on-line presence, a website, a blog, a following on social media – Facebook, Twitter, or Instagram. It was overwhelming and good to know, of course. This was so much good information and I learned so much.



I met Brian McLaren at the Wild Goose. I told him about our CE program with "flat Jesus". He was pleased to pose for a photo with me and my flat Jesus.

The Wild Goose Festival was the first week of my Study Leave. The second week I began writing what I hope to be a book one day. God has led me on such a journey in my life. I have read so many people's points of view. Amid all of that I am confident that I have a message to share. And I believe that this is how our 'wild goose'- God works! Not only do I have something to share – perhaps you do, too. I know that there are those among you who write poetry. Write! And there are those among you that appreciate craft projects and have an idea in mind. Create! And there are those among you who appreciate gardening. Garden!



Invitation to Star Island

Many of our church family have been making a pilgrimage of sorts to our Star Island home over Labor Day weekend for the Star Gathering Family Weekend Retreat for many years. Star Island is part of the Isle of Shoals about an hour by boat off the coast of Portsmouth, NH and is home to the shared UU and UCC Conferences as a retreat center.

On island there is a wide range of accommodations including the grand old Oceanic Hotel which also houses the dining hall, main lobby with its main desk and communication hub, a gift shop, a bookstore, a snack bar, and a huge wraparound porch lined with rockers. You'll see people gathering in small groups with old and new friends, chatting, or reading, or doing a craft, or just soaking in the view and the fresh salt air off the ocean. Other accommodations include single, double, and triple rooms in cottages and motel units all connected to the main hotel building by wooden porches also lined with rockers.

Our theme this year is Nurturing Self: Body, Mind, and Spirit. Our theme speaker is Jen Messner, a nutritionist and healer who will be offering at least three different workshop sessions over the weekend. There are lots of activities planned that you can participate in including Jen's workshops, making sea glass windows, an ice cream social, doing a skit or sharing a special talent in the talent show, evening chapel by candlelight, kayaking in sheltered Gosport Harbor, a morning Polar Plunge or swimming later in the day, hiking around the island. Or you can spend time just relaxing, reading, journaling, rocking on the porch,



napping, chatting with friends, or just lazing in the sun with a lime Rickey or an ice cream from the snack bar.

The conference fee of \$50 per person covers expenses of the conference, while your room and board charge covers your room and three hearty meals each day served either family style or by servers at buffet tables, depending on Covid protocols at the time. Prices also include the boat ride out and back on the Thomas Leighton. Room and board prices range from \$391-\$933, which depend on which type of lodging you request, whether you come on Friday for three nights, or Saturday for 2 nights, and whether you choose a single or shared room. On Sunday night you can also order a lobster dinner for an additional charge.

We hope you will join us this year as we gather on Star Island to create beloved community yet again! If you have any questions, any of us would be more than happy to talk with you.

The oldest church in the immediate area, First Parish Church was founded by Scotch-Irish Presbyterians in the spring of 1719. Faith was and continues to be a priority. Worship was held one day after arrival; a church body was organized in one month and a building was built in 1722. A "more imposing structure" replaced the first in 1769, and although altered and expanded through time, the main building and sanctuary remain our center of worship.
