From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Child of God,

Welcome! September is the "get up and go" month, isn't it? Schools go back into session and the rhythm of our lives shifts. Here at church, we begin a new "year" on Sunday morning with the Narrative Lectionary. This will be our 3rd year using this Lectionary. I hope that you are enjoying it as much as I am. I am also excited about our "Sacred Conversations", the second Sunday of the month that will follow worship for 15 - 20 minutes. These will consist of topics that you choose and submit. We already have topics for September (safety), October (Meetinghouse update) and November (how decisions get made). What would you like more information on? Our conversations are simply that. Sharing information. No votes. No record keeping or decision making. When important information is shared, which involves an action item, whichever task force or Board will take it to their next meeting.

We are excited about launching new Adult and Children's Faith Formation. We tried something new (a suggestion from the Brown's). We sponsored a "show and tell". You'll see more about it later in this issue. I pray that you will consider participating in Adult Faith Formation this year. We read interesting material — and I have to say that my favorite part is the sharing. We don't all agree. We don't all like all the material we are reading. AND we love and respect one another to discuss openly and honestly our faith journey.

Over the summer, we read "Faith after Doubt". Many of us did not quite understand author Brian McLaren's arguments - and we appreciated his research, nonetheless. There was one page that I marveled over, and I'd like to share it with you now. This is Brian McLaren's opinion, and these are his words:

"I picture (the Apostle) Paul as a wiry old bald guy who squints. I imagine him in Galatia, in a crowded house, leaning forward, elbows on knees, almost vibrating with intensity as he speaks to a couple dozen people in the flickering lamplight. He's trying to tell them in person what we have recorded in one of his letters, written about twenty years after Jesus' death: "The only thing that matters," he whisper-shouts, "is faith expressing itself in love." Then he leans forward even farther and repeats himself, louder now, his bony hands wildly gesticulating for emphasis: "The *only* thing that matters is faith expressing itself in *love!*"

Immediately, I imagine people getting restless. First one, then three, then five hands shoot up with questions and objections.

"What about circumcision? Moses commanded that!" one says

"Circumcision or uncircumcision . . . it's utterly insignificant," he says. "The *only* thing that matters is faith expressing itself in love!"

"What about our dietary restrictions? You're not giving up on that biblical absolute, I hope!" another asks.

The only thing that matters is *faith* expressing itself in *love*," Paul says, a little louder.

"What about the Gentiles? You're not talking about granting them equality in our community, are you?" another asks tensely. "That's just not right!"

The *what abouts* continue . . . observing certain holidays, avoiding meat that had been sacrificed to idols, not fraternizing with people of other religions. . . and each time, Paul responds with the same words, finally ending in a voice so gentle it is barely more than a whisper: "The *only* thing that matters is faith expressing itself in *love*." I see his eyes brim with tears." (pg 148)

Wow! Just wow. I have never heard such a beautiful rendering of the Gospel of Jesus Christ! Friends, the only thing that matters is faith expressing itself in love! As we say in my profession: "That'll preach!"

1. The Homebrewed Christianity Guide to the Holy Spirit: Hand-Raisers, Han, and the Holy Ghost By: Grace Ji-Sun Kim

This isn't simply a guide to what the church is saying about the Holy Spirit - it's a guide to actually opening our theological imaginations to a Spirit that is present, active and calling us to participate in life-giving work.

2. Accidental Saints By: Nadia Bolz-Weber

In a time when many have rightly become dis-illusioned with Christianity, Accidental Saints dem-onstrates what happens when ordinary people share bread and wine, struggle with scripture together, and tell each other the truth about their real lives.

Grace in Tension is centered on Jesus' interactions with Martha and Mary in the gospels and affirms that although God doesn't create our tension, God does show up in the midst of it to lead us through.

6. The Gospel on the Ground: The Grit and Glory of the Early Church in Acts - Bible Study Book with Video By: Kristi McLelland

Come along with biblical culturalist Kristi McLelland as she unpacks the life of the early church in the book of Acts and shows us that the kingdom of God is always on the move, always looking outward to bring meaning and joy to a world searching for true fulfillment and hope.

The oldest church in the immediate area, First Parish Church was founded by Scotch-Irish Presbyterians in the spring of 1719. Faith was and continues to be a priority. Worship was held one day after arrival; a church body was organized in one month and a building was built in 1722. A "more imposing structure" replaced the first in 1769, and although altered and expanded through time, the main building and sanctuary remain our center of worship.
