From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Child of God,

Paul, in his letter to the church in Thessalonica, urges affirming and compassionate Christian practices: joy, prayer, and gratitude.

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18: "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

Joy.

One of the songs that we sing in my chorus (Songweavers) has these words: "Joy is a decision we make every day. Wake up in the morning and chase those blues away." The Bible speaks of joy and rejoicing in hundreds of ways. In another of Paul's letters, when he writes to the church in Philippi, Paul emphasizes this imperative: "Rejoice in the Lord always. And AGAIN, I say rejoice!" Joy is a faith practice. Joy is a decision.

Prayer.

We talk a lot about our relationship with God. It is important to us. And a relationship with God warrants communication. Prayer is our vehicle. Anne Lamott famously wrote that there are three kinds of prayers: help, thanks, and wow! (She wrote a book by that title.) Indeed, we ask for God's help. We express gratitude for the blessings we enjoy. And we say wow! Especially when we

witness miracles – like the one that our friend Michelle just received. Wow. Just wow! And thank You, God!

Gratitude.

November is the month of Thanksgiving. AND giving thanks is not just a day – it's a life practice. How are you at giving thanks? Do you make a gratitude list? How often? Do you participate in a gratitude texting group? (If you don't, would you like to? Just let me know and we'll start one for November!) According to an article in the Harvard Health Publishing Blog in August of 2021: "Giving thanks makes you happier." The article proclaims: "In positive psychology research, gratitude is strongly and consistently associated with greater happiness. Gratitude helps people feel more positive emotions, relish good experiences, improve their health, deal with adversity, and build strong relationships."

Joy, prayer, and gratitude – these are three faith practices that are simple and easy to do... when we remember to practice them! This November, make a deal with yourself to practice these three tenets more than ever before. And then watch how God responds to your revitalized faith practices.

PS: a couple of ideas to cultivate gratitude:

Write a thank-you note to someone - once a month!

Thank someone mentally. This is a blessing to them.

Keep a gratitude journal.

Join a gratitude texting group.

Count your blessings. Pick a number (3? 4? 5?). Write them down. Every day.

Pray Prayer cultivates gratitude.

<u>Meditate</u>. Mindfulness meditation involves focusing on the present moment without judgment - and to supercharge your meditation: focus on what you're grateful for!

Boards and Committees

ALL HANDS-ON DECK! YOU CAN HELP!

Many hands make light work. As busy as we ALL are, planning meetings can take up more time than we can afford. Time is precious. Your church leaders understand. We realize that we do not need Boards of many members. We can accomplish a great deal with smaller Boards who identify tasks for more individuals. Many people are willing to help with short term projects, but do not want to commit to 2 or 3 years on a Board or committee, going to monthly meetings and doing all the work themselves.

Perhaps there is a task or two that you DO have time to do. It is no longer necessary for 6-10 individuals do all the related work. Instead, we can share responsibilities and tasks. It may be more efficient for 3 people to plan, organize, and delegate the work that needs to be done.

Kids of all ages can join in the United Church of

Christ's <u>Climate Hope Cards art contest</u>. Participating children will design postcards that highlight hope for and love for the earth. Kids of all ages can get a template and info at the <u>Climate Hope Cards web page</u> or on the **FPC** <u>webpage</u>.

Beginning Oct. 4, families can submit their children's earth-loving drawings, doodles and sketches. Then, UCC <u>environmental justice</u> leaders will print the winning art on postcards. An online award ceremony will be held January 7 on Zoom.

Finally, UCC churches everywhere can help send these postcards to elected officials, calling for action now on climate change. "We're in the middle of climate and environmental crises, so we need everyone involved, from the youngest kids on up," said Andy Wells-Bean, UCC environmental justice fellow.

Wells-Bean is spearheading the Climate Hope Cards campaign. He noted that it's a simple but significant way for any youth to get involved. Anyone can also download the template at <u>ucc.org/ClimateHopeCards</u>. What should kids draw? Anything that demonstrates their love for God's creation, according to Wells-Bean. "Think about the earth. Think about climate change. Think about how you want to protect the earth," he said.

ELECTRONIC GIVING - Venmo Announcement

VENMO IS NOW AVAILABLE TO MAKE FINANCIAL DONATIONS TO FIRST PARISH CHURCH

Anyone can now use **Venmo** to make contributions to the church via credit card (3% fee applied), debit card (no fee), or direct transfer (no fee) from their checking account directly into the church's account. Having this option makes things simpler for congregation members, friends, and visitors who wish to contribute in this way and could attract contributions from community members who visit our website or know about our activities.

To experience these benefits of Venmo (the most widely used of these electronic transfer services) while avoiding the drawbacks, you will need to follow these procedures:

- 1. Download the Venmo app on your phone. Click "pay". Type in @first-parish. Fill in the blank labelled "what's it for" (VERY IMPORTANT). Examples are: general fund, mission, building rehabilitation, Christian Ed. The contribution can also be split among these categories in any desired proportion that you specify. You must also indicate if this is payment toward a previously made pledge or is a new, separate contribution—e.g., "October pledge toward operating budget."
- 2. Click on the button labelled "public," which is the default. That will then give you the option to restrict who sees that you made a contribution to the church. If you don't do this, anyone who uses Venmo can see that you made a contribution to the church (but not the amount).
- 3. Enter the amount. Then enter your payment info (checking account number if that's what you choose, debit card (no fee charged), or a credit card (3% fee). Once you've done this once, it will show up as a payment option for you to choose.

If a contribution is made that does not contain the required information about what it's for, Julie Greenfield, a member of the finance committee, will call you for clarification. Please be respectful of her time by always indicating exactly what your payment is for, so that she does not have to call you. If you cannot be reached, the default for your payment will be that it will go into the general fund as a new contribution, not payment of an existing pledge.

To find out how to set up a Venmo account (it's VERY easy), and learn more about it, please visit this website: <u>https://venmo.com/signup/</u> You will be asked to provide one or more methods by which you will make payments, and your formal name. Worship was held one day after arrival; a church body was organized in one month and a building was built in 1722. A "more imposing structure" replaced the first in 1769, and although altered and expanded through time, the main building and sanctuary remain our center of worship.
