From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Child of God,

Sabbath keeping. Why is it so <u>very</u> important to allow oneself a Sabbath rest? Whenever I have a big question like this one, I go to scripture and listen to what God has to say. Genesis 2:3 "So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested from all the work that he had done in creation." Exodus 20:8 "Remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy. 9 Six days you shall labor and do all your work. Deuteronomy 5: 12: 'Observe the Sabbath day and keep it holy, as the Lord your God commanded you. 13 Six days you shall labor and do all your work. 14 But the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God; you shall not do any work—you, or (a long list of family members including anyone who works for you) 15b therefore the Lord your God commanded you.

Sabbath keeping. It was God's idea. It is so important to being completely present, that God – God's self – started it! What is Sabbath? It's a day of rest. God created and God worked six days in a row. And then God rested. It was so important that God listed this behavior among the 10 most important things that a human being can do. God commanded that all people – every person – needs to take a day of rest.

Do you? Do you take a day that is "Sabbath rest" for you?

Over the centuries, different people rest on different days. It is Saturday to many. It is Sunday to others. And to those of us who work for God, the church, and that work happens to be on the Sabbath day, we take a different day. I take Monday. What is your day? Do you teach your children to take some time? In our society today, a whole day is pretty difficult. That doesn't mean that you don't try to take some time, a few hours, and be at Sabbath rest. Try to sit and look around. Take an inventory. What do you see? What do you smell? What do you hear? How does your body feel? Can you feel your heartbeat? Can you feel your lungs contract when you breathe out and expand when you breathe in? Do you stop to read a book that isn't related to your work? Do you just sit and watch the clouds go by? Do you take the time to make of list of all the things that you are grateful for?

Sabbath rest. It's that necessary time when we recharge our Spiritual battery, and we renew our connection with the divine and the divinity within ourselves. For us, as Christians, the Sunday morning worship is part of our Sabbath rest process. It's such an important time for us to gather and remember whose we are and who loves us so much. Since we are participants in our culture that focuses on to-do lists, efficiency, and getting things done, there is a trap. The unfortunate ruse that we can fall into is using Sunday as a time to talk to one another about this decision or that plan or this project or that outcome. All too often, we think of a question for someone on the Board of Missions and we think "Oh, I'll talk to her/him when I see them on Sunday." OK. It's time for confessions. How often do you wait to talk to this person or that person, thinking it'll be somehow better to talk to them on Sunday? I totally understand. And I am wondering if we could make an agreement that Sunday is Sabbath time? At least until after the worship service. It's 2023. We have email and phones. We can send an email. We can call or text. Whatever the question or comment is, we do not need to wait until Sunday morning. Let's see if we can be better at allowing one another our Sabbath rest. And may God bless our efforts.

Take care of yourself. Remember your Sabbath rest.

Message from the Moderator

Our income for 2023 through Feb is about \$1200 below what was budgeted; pledges are running behind. Our actual operating expenses are about what was expected. There are 2 other concerns with our finances. First, the budget we approved as a congregation specified a deficit of about \$20,000. Our Bridge the Gap campaign has only raised about one-fourth of this amount (\$5630) to date. A second concern is that if we hire a music director soon, we may not have enough money to cover his/her salary for the full year. Please help us meet our financial obligations by keeping up with your pledge and increasing it if possible. (Randy Brown)

Board of Personnel

Personnel has been busy posting ads for CE Director and revising ads for Music Director. We worked with CE committee to revise the job description and write an ad to be posted on NH UCC website, HireMeNH website and Indeed. We did receive 1 application but felt that person was not a good fit for FPC.

We received an application for the Music Director, but after a phone interview he felt that a job with FPC would not work for him. We have been in communication with another person interested in the Music Director job. He will be the visiting musician at our Palm Sunday service.

Personnel and Pastor Deborah met with Stephanie CM-Berg and offered her the job of CE Director. She will start on April 2nd. She will be working on average 10 hours a week (with some weeks off for school vacation). She has been attending FPC for several years and has 2 children in CCEP. Stephanie has been working with the CE Board and attending & participating in CCEP. She is a great fit for this position. We feel very blessed to have her and look forward to seeing all she will bring to the FPC education program.

Family Promise Update

One of our missions is supporting Family Promise of Southern NH, the program that houses homeless families and helps them get back on their feet. We continue to provide a dinner for the residents the first Thursday of every month, and we provide financial support as well. The facility is located in Nashua.

The program is thriving. It currently has 19 families, comprising 24 adults and 24 children, with additional families being interviewed daily to replace current families graduating from the program and finding their own housing. As noted previously, FPSNH was selected for the Charity of the Year award for 2022 by the Derry/Londonderry Chamber of Commerce. It is also the largest residential Family Promise program in the country, and a model for others.

As you may have heard, Family Promise is currently in negotiations to purchase an additional property in Derry and retrofit it for 8 homeless families. The program has signed an agreement to purchase the currently unused Vintage Grace adult day care facility, pending zoning and planning board approval and grants to cover the cost. While there is no guarantee, the program's executive director and Board of Trustees are confident that the grants needed will be awarded, based on conversations with various agencies.


