Maybe the institutional church worship service is – or needs to – change because God, the wondrous Creating God that we worship on Sunday morning, is far from irrelevant and is simply waiting for us to catch up to the urgings of the Holy Spirit.

People in the community need to know how much we care and how much we do. Sunday School


November

Board of Missions

Mission Board is getting ready for a big event they sponsor in the month of November - THANKSGIVING "FOOD -not Baskets but FOOD ASSISTANCE

For several years, Mission Board has been giving Grocery cards in the amount of \$25 in lieu of Food Baskets. For many reasons this has been more appreciated so here we go again.

We will be raising funds from our generous congregation to purchase 30 food cards to distribute to the Caregivers clients. For the past few years, we have donated 30 cards at \$25 each. These are really appreciated Last year we raised over \$600, and Mission supplemented the cost of 30 cards (\$750) from our Mission funds.

This year we need to raise \$1500 for 60 cards as we are helping the Upper Room provide for many families who are no longer being served by another organization. We offered 30 cards for these families. We ask that our congregation (small and generous) help as best you are able.

In addition, the Upper Room also has 200 families formerly served by the Salvation Army by providing actual food. We pledged 200 cans of cranberry sauce for the 200 bags of food the Upper Room will provide to these families.


A large team of church members plus expert contractors are working hard to make this happen. Come learn about the latest plans and the remaining work at a special session after worship service on Sunday, November 5th:

We'll share details of this biggest Sanctuary renovation since 1884, explaining how we'll upgrade systems for modern use and to better accommodate disabilities without harming the historic look and feel. We'll present designs for the wall and flooring finishes, answer all your questions, and afterward offer a guided tour.

You'll also have the chance to help make all this happen through a new Get Back In!!! fundraising campaign we'll launch that day. This will feature some nice benefits to donors, including double matching of early gifts. Refreshments will be available for those attending in person, and we will Zoom the session for those who aren't. We'll also have all the information and giving opportunities available online.


