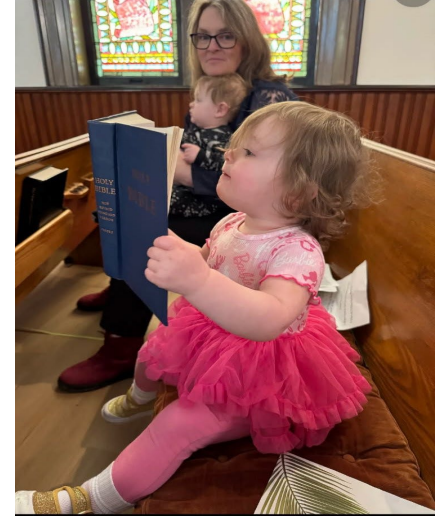
Pastor's Retirement Party May 4

COUNCIL CORNER

Council met on Wednesday, April 16. Here are the highlights:

- **Report from the BAC on rehab work**
 - Several tech issues encountered during the move to the sanctuary are being addressed.
 - Refurbishment of the narthex is behind schedule due to unforeseen commitments by the contractor. We anticipate completing the plasterwork by the end of next week, followed by painting and electrical work. We hope to receive a full assembly permit by May 4th but may still be limited to 133 people on that day.
 - Working on a comprehensive plan for the lower level, roof system, and snow protection as well as installation of handrails for the connector door. The architect is currently working on the design, but progress is moving slowly. We're hoping to receive a quote for the roof work next week and complete the L-chip grant application for the roof by mid-June.
 - We have ample funding for immediate projects, but we'll need significant financial resources for future endeavors.
 - Historic preservation is planning to recognize the founders on May 18th. We're hopeful that Linda and Michelle from Northern Ireland will participate in reading parts of the first service conducted by Rev. McGregor.
- **Pastoral search update**
 - Profile has been completed and will be submitted on Tuesday April 21.
 - Preparing interview questions to ask candidates; search committee asks for any suggestions congregation may have for these interviews
- **This was Pastor Deborah's last Council meeting.** Council thanked Pastor Deborah for her dedication to First Parish and hard work, through good times and bad, over the past 11 years. She leaves us a much healthier, collaborative, and cohesive church than when she first arrived.
 - A chart was distributed showing how Pastor Deborah typically divides her time among her responsibilities and a suggestion for what this may mean for how our bridge pastor, Rev Bob Fellows, spends his time. Since he will be only $\frac{3}{4}$ time, Boards and members will need to help fill the gaps (e.g., proofreading the newsletter).
 - Pastor Deborah said it has been an honor and a privilege to serve First Parish, and that she will find it hard to leave. She urged us to communicate by phone, not just email, and to follow a few basic health communication principles during this time of transition: 1. Assume positive intent. 2. Use more words to describe situations. 3. Ask more clarifying questions. 4. Be curious when someone does something that surprises you. 5. Extend grace.
 - Pastor Deborah noted that after May 18, she is not allowed to communicate with First Parish. Special arrangements, in consultation with Rev Fellows, may be made when appropriate.
- **Treasurer's report**
 - Cash position is solid—current balance of nearly \$36,000. Far better than 4 years ago, when our balance was a cash *deficit* of \$34,000.
 - Year to date income received is slightly greater than budget, expenses are slightly below budget, so we are in a good position through March.
 - Treasurer suggested that we inventory and document our property, for insurance purposes.
- **Facilities**
 - Sanctuary Tower and the meeting house were sprayed by New England pest control to eliminate the wasps.
 - Elevator fire systems test completed.
 - An energy audit was conducted this week. Almost all the lights are LED, but the windows are old. We can remove some of the plywood and install more insulation.
 - Nutfield has signed a contract with a 5% increase. YMCA signed a contract and will return for 7 weeks this summer, starting in late June and ending in middle August with a 5% increase as well.

COUNCIL CORNER – continued

- **Personnel**
 - Pastor Deborah’s exit interview is scheduled for May 9.
- **Deacons**
 - Busy with Easter preparations, services at Sunrise, 8:30, and 10:00.
 - Two new members joining on May 11.
- **Safe Church**
 - We must identify and name exterior doors as part of our safety plans. A meeting with relevant boards will be held to discuss this matter.
- **Other issues**
 - Anne Englehardt attended the Chambers Women’s Empowerment event, which featured two remarkable speakers. One speaker discussed the importance of financial literacy, which is not adequately taught in schools. The other speaker represented the R.E.A.C.H. shelter, which provides support to individuals affected by abuse in Manchester.
- **Fundraising**
 - Thank you to Paul for getting the banner for Spring Fling. Sign-ups for Pastor Deborah’s celebration and Spring Fling available in the hall this Sunday. See Cathy Z with any questions.

First Parish Church's Identity Statements:

The United Church of Christ is guided by covenants rather than creeds. We don't tell you what you must believe. As an organization we discern how we see ourselves in God's Creation. We are then guided by various statements, which are voted upon by the entire congregation at a meeting called for that purpose. See below our Mission Statement, Our Open & Affirming Statement and our new Vision Statement.

Mission Statement

(Background: First Parish worked with nationally known consultant Alice Mann to discern who we were as a church. The result was the Mission Statement. Over the past decade leaders have looked at this statement to see if it still fits. It does and so it stands.)

“We are a community of faith built upon a firm foundation of worship, prayer, and education. In affirming diversity, we are dedicated to welcoming all people who seek the Word of God, Christian fellowship, and service to others. In partnership with Christ and led by the Holy Spirit, we reach out to the ever-widening community through active and loving ministry.”
(Adopted April 2000)

Open & Affirming Statement

(Background: In 2013, First Parish underwent a dedicated study with the goal of discerning whether we felt called to become Open & Affirming. The result of that process was a vote to be listed as Open & Affirming and the following statement.)

“We affirm Christ's call to love God and love our neighbors as ourselves. We therefore pledge ourselves to be open to and affirming of all people of every age, race, ethnicity, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, physical or mental ability, socioeconomic status, family configuration, or cultural background. All who affirm the love of Christ in their lives are welcome into this community and to share fully in its life and ministry. We rejoice in the worth, gifts, and dignity of every person as a child of God.” (Adopted January 2014)

Vision Statement

(Background: In 2023, the Council recognized that although we had a Mission Statement that we liked, we lacked a Vision Statement. The following is the result of this process.)

“To live our faith by being a compassionate, accepting, and generous presence in the community: a church where all people find purpose and belonging.” (Adopted January 2024)
